Dear Students, Parents and Carers,

It has been a fantastic year for the Post-19 service, building on the successes of our pilot year. The last 12 months have been full of 'wow' moments, and I have been delighted to see how well our students have engaged in their community based learning. All of our students have spent time in the community, completing either work experience or leisure and sports activities, as well as increasing their independence around traveling, shopping and dining out in restaurants and cafes.

The Post-19 service launched its Advisory Board this year, with our first meeting taking place in June chaired by John Crawford, the CEO of Yarrow Housing. The Advisory Board is an important part of ensuring the development of the service continues to grow in the right direction. Currently members include Denise Largin, CEO of The Camden Society and Sonia Simon, Care Service Manager from Yarrow Housing. Following this initial meeting, we are excited to see how the Advisory Board develops in the new academic year.

One of my personal highlights this year has been the feedback from our Tutors when working in the community. All of the staff have spoken about how our students have become active citizens of their communities, making connections with local businesses and services. It is not unusual for one of our students to be stopped in the street and have a local say hello or ask how they are getting on. One of our aims for our students is for them to have a sense of belonging in their community, and be an active part of society.

In our final weeks of the term, it was a pleasure to join our students on their end-of-year trip to Brighton. The trip was organised by our partner, Yarrow. All of the students who attended enjoyed lunch on the Pier, a trip to the Sea Life centre and ice cream overlooking the sunny beach and sea. Even though the journey was a little longer than expected, our students managed the trip extremely well.

In September, the Post-19 service will be able to welcome 8 students. All of our current students will be returning and they will be joined by new faces from both Tram House and other schools. During the new academic year, we have plans to open a second Post-19 Hub, like our location on Goldhawk Road. We are currently researching locations and expect our next location to be south of the Thames.

I am very proud of the achievements our students have made this year, and extremely excited to see what will happen in the new academic year. I hope you and your family have a relaxing and enjoyable summer break, and I look forward to welcoming you back in the new academic year.
